

Plant some HABITAT in your BACKYARD

Planting native plants in your backyard is a great way to provide habitat and improve biodiversity. Prickly and shrubby plants, such as spikey grevillea and bottlebrush, provide birds, small mammals and lizards with a safe place to hide from foxes and cats.

As the weather warms up, take the opportunity to create a hiding place and plant some habitat in your backyard.
