Bugs IN OUR Water



Aquatic Macro-invertebrates are also known as waterbugs!

Aquatic

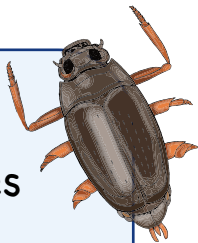
Means **water**.

Macro

Means **big** (we can see them with the naked eye). The opposite is micro (we need a microscope to see them).

Invertebrates

Means **without a backbone**.



Waterbugs are tiny creatures found in rivers, creeks, ponds and wetlands. The number and different types of waterbugs we find in a waterway tells us how healthy it is.

Have a look at this graphic of a river, which shows which waterbugs will survive in areas of Good, Fair and Poor water quality.

Draw a line from the waterbug to the type of water quality it will survive in.

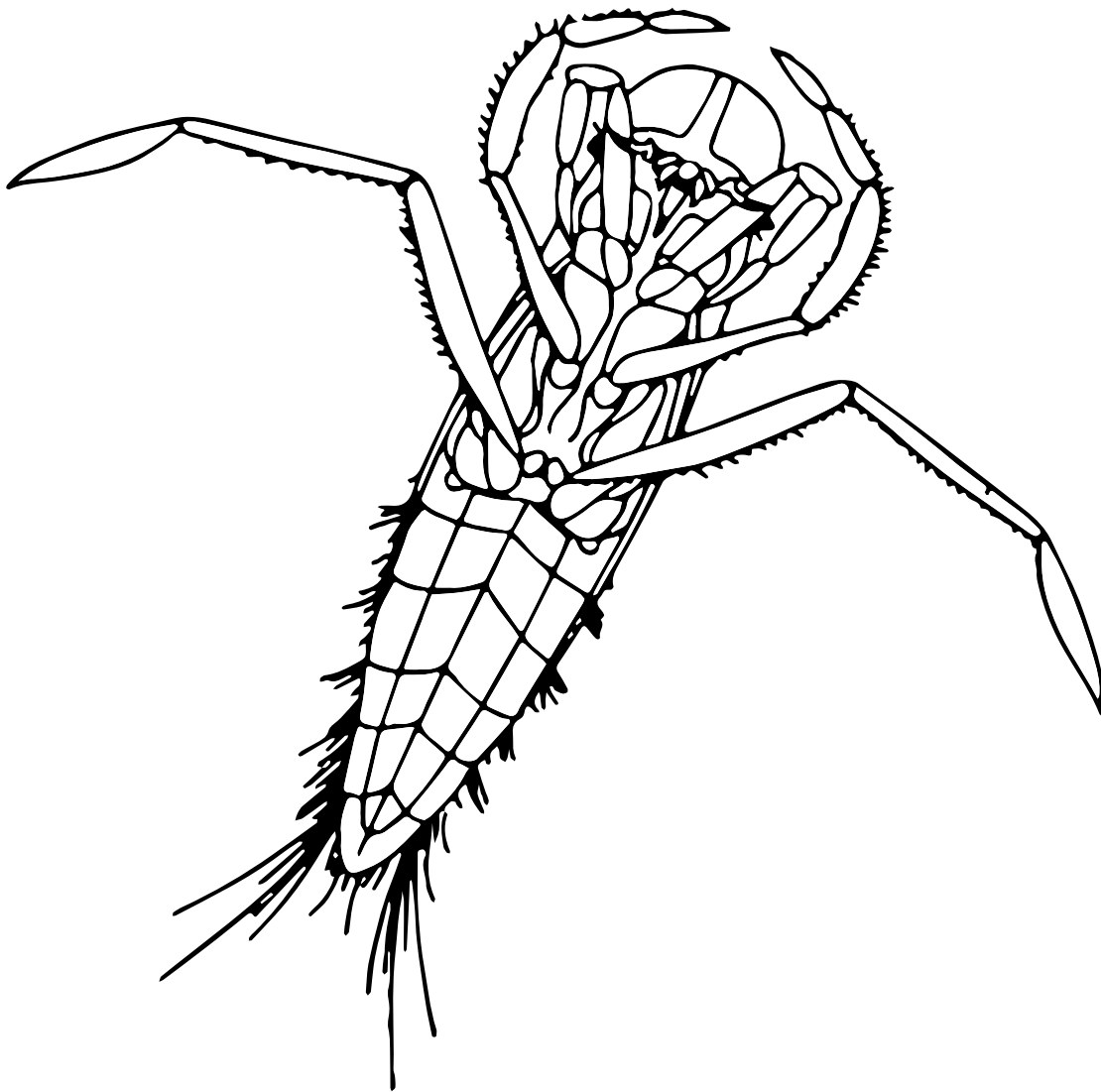
